**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:** Doctors For You (DFY) started its response in Kokrajhar district on the basis of initial assessment that was carried out on 30.12.14. Gossaigaon subdivision of Kokrajhar district is our priority target area. A team of DFY consisting of Doctors, field officers and coordinators are engaged in this response program. The objective of this program is to provide reproductive health care services, awareness on water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH), de-worming and primary health care services. So far DFY has provided the above services in seven relief camps. Moreover coordination with ASHA workers and camp leaders are established so that the inhabitants of the relief camps are linked up to other services also. Major activities of this response are as follows

1. WASH awareness
2. De-worming
3. Reproductive health services
4. General health camp
5. Health awareness

**Water, Sanitation and Hygiene program (WASH):** Most of the relief camps were set up in open fields and some other in school premises. Moreover the huge no. of population in each camp jeopardized the water, sanitation and hygiene scenario. Therefore one of the prime focuses of DFY's response is to create awareness among the camp dwellers about sanitation and hygiene. Water purification methods with the help of bleaching powders and chlorine tablets were demonstrated and the bleaching powders and chlorine tablets are distributed. Awareness on importance of hand washing is also generated in the camps especially among children.

**De-worming:** Extensive de-worming program was conducted in 5 following relief camps under Gossaigaon subdivision.

1. Pakhriguri relief camp
2. Ultapani relief camp
3. Bharatnagar relief camp
4. Athiabari relief camp.
5. Saralpara relief camp

A total of 506 persons were provided with *Albandazole* tablets and solutions to both children below two years and above

**Reproductive health services:** Prior experience in the field (BTAD conflict response, 2012) showed that reproductive health is one of the most vulnerable issues that the camp dwellers have to face. Therefore awareness program on reproductive health care was generated among the pregnant ladies with the help of the ASHA workers of the respective camps clean delivery kits were distributed to visibly pregnant and women pregnant with seven month and above. Health talk on exclusive breast feeding was also organised among the pregnant ladies. The above table (table2) shows the camp wise data of registered pregnant women and no. of women distributed with clean delivery kits. The contents of clean delivery kits are as follows.

1. 1 Soap
2. 1 Pair of gloves
3. 1 Plastic Sheet
4. 1 Cotton cloth to wipe the baby
5. 1 Cotton cloth to wrap the baby
6. 1 Razor blade (for cutting the umbilical cord)
7. 1 Cord ties or clamps

**Health camp:** Two general health camps was organised in Athiabari and Bharatnagar relief camp. The purpose of the health camp was to provide general health check up and medicine to the inhabitants of the relief camps. Vitamin B complex, Vitamin C and calcium were found to be priority medical need among the dwellers of Bharatnagar relief camp. While in Athiabari patients were treated for minor cuts and bruises, cough, fever and body pain.
