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#### 1. Background

Doctors For You North East Regional Office (DFY NERO) restarted the MISP project as Doctors For You Initial Emergency Service Package (DIESP) in 10 camps in Chirang district in January 2013. In this version of DIESP, the main objectives were the promotion of institutional delivery and IEC activities to promote good reproductive health practice. The continuation of the MISP project was necessary in view of current situation in Chirang district in the aftermath of the ethnic violence. Promotion of good reproductive health practices is one of the main objectives of the project taking into account the previous experience of DFY in the district since last 6 months. The project also endeavors to create awareness about various health programs and schemes for reproductive and child health that are currently available to the community like the Janani Suraksha Yojna (JSY), Janani Shishu Suraksha Karyakram (JSSK) and others.





#### 2. Numbers of Camps Covered and Pregnancy Detected

During the third month of DIESP project in March it was observed that out of 10 camps we targeted, most of the camps in Chirang district were evacuated by the last week of the month and the most of the camp inmates returned to the respective villages from where they had been displaced.

The lists of the camps evacuated are as follows:

- 1. Majrabari
- 2. Doturi 2
- 3. Modern Academy
- 4. Basugaon
- 5. Amguri
- 6. Gomorgaon
- 7. Noapara
- 8. Doturi 3

And the few camps where population still exists are as follows:

- 1. Mojabari (15 households)
- 2. Dangsiapara 1(80 households)

The total number of pregnancy detected in the third month was 63. Even the registered pregnant women who shifted to their villages were tracked by the team so that can avail the benefits under the project.

#### 3. Major activities done in camps

#### 3.1 Ante Natal Care (ANC)

In the month of March 2013 we covered the same 10 camps. DFY-NERO team did ANC checkup to each and every pregnant woman who were present during the time of visit by communicating with the ASHA of respective camp. All the pregnant women who were registered earlier were provided with Calcium, Iron folic and Multivitamin tablets and those who were newly registered were also provided the same if she was found to be in 4<sup>th</sup> month of pregnancy and above. The pregnant women those who had reached 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, and 10<sup>th</sup> months of pregnancy were provided with delivery kits by giving demo of use of the kit. The women who have doubts regarding their pregnancy were provided with urine pregnancy test kit (UPT) to get the confirmation. ANC checkups were done in the villages which were accessible by the team.

### 3.2 Post Natal Care (PNC)

Apart from ANC check up, 17 PNC checkups were done to women who had recently delivered a child in the camps in Chirang district during the month of March. They were provided with medication if required after the check up. Health messages like immunization, exclusive breast feeding and others were also promoted by the team.

#### 3.5 General Health Checkup

Apart from ANC, PNC and RTI/STI checkup we also did general health checkup to the camp inmates during the intervention. They were provided medicines available with us like paracetamol, ORS, cipladin ointment, amoxycilin, contraceptive pills and condoms.

#### 3.6 Health Awareness Programme

Health awareness was one of the most integral part of the project for promoting awareness of various health related issues among the displaced population so that it would lead to good health and hygiene practices for minimizing disease prevalence in the long run.

Health talks about key health issues were given with the participation of the camp inmates in order to maximize the impact of these talks and to get real time feedback from the camp inmates about any barriers in accessing the health services in their community. Training of the local *dai* to facilitate clean and safe delivery was also practiced along with the role play with the help of ASHAs.

DFY gives priority in counseling of individuals, mass awareness and discussion all the time in camps.

#### 3.7 Distribution of sanitary napkins and markin clothes

Promoting of sanitary hygiene was continued in the camps in the third month of the DIESP project. DFY has registered all the families (one with sanitary needy individuals) of 10 camps and accordingly sanitary napkin and markin clothes were distributed. Simple and easy provision was acquired for refilling of the family cards with napkins and markin clothes in every month. DFY team distributed sanitary napkin and markin cloths in 9 camps since one of the camps was evacuated in March, 2013.

During February last and beginning of March 2013, DFY observed that most of the inmates started shifting from camps to their villages which included some critical cases of third trimester pregnancies. Doctor For You tracked those women in their respective villages like Bhalatol, Nalbari, Bhabanipur, Narayanpur, Noapara and others to ensure safe motherhood of the registered women. DFY doctors also made house visits to provide an uninterrupted ANC care for which they are committed to the people.
